How to Use English Articles

Α	A thing = any thing (use "a" for a noun that begins with a
	consonant).
An	An object = any object (use "an" for a noun that begins
	with a vowel).
The	The object = some specific object (any noun).
(no article)	No article is needed for certain locations and activities
	that are part of daily life: home, school, work, church,
	class, lunch, etc.

Examples

I want to drive <u>a</u> car. (Any car will do. I don't want to walk!)
I want to drive <u>the</u> car. (It's the car we are in, or the car we own.)

I need to go to \underline{a} store. (Any store will do.) I need to go to \underline{the} store. (It's the store we usually go to - such as a grocery store that is nearby.)

I see \underline{a} child. (Used the first time that we refer to this child; the child is unknown to us.)

I see <u>the</u> child. (Refers to the child we have just spoken of, or someone we expect.)

I drove past <u>a</u> school. (I've never seen that school before.)
I drove past <u>the</u> school where my son goes. (I know that specific school.)
My son goes to school here. (No article necessary since it is his regular school.)
