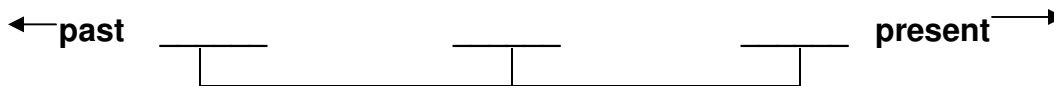


Talk Time Topic: American History

Background:

Today we will talk about 3 important periods in American history.

1492-1776: Settling a Territory

In 1492, Christopher Columbus discovered America when he was looking for a way to sail from Spain to India. When he saw the Native Americans who lived here, Columbus thought that they were Indians. Many Europeans came to America after Columbus. Most came to find wealth or to have religious freedom. The Native Americans helped the settlers to survive by teaching them how to farm and fish.

1776-1861: Forming a Nation

In 1776 many people in America lived in English colonies, but they did not want to pay taxes to England. The people fought a revolution -- a war to be free from England. We celebrate American independence on July 4th. After the war, the U.S. formed a government that had an elected president instead of a king.

1861-1941: Expanding West

In 1861 the people in the US had a conflict about slavery. The South made money by farming and they wanted to allow slavery. The people of the North worked in industry and they thought slavery was wrong. The North fought the South in the Civil War. The North won and slavery was ended. People began to move west. Many hardworking immigrants came to America in this period and helped to make America strong.
