After the fire, some Christians helped Daoud and the Muslim community. Pastor Bill Williamson shared his church building. He gave the Muslims a place to worship and pray. Daoud and Bill have different religions, but they have become good friends.

Daoud often worries about Muslims in America. He says, "We see our kids bullied in schools over their faith..." Daoud wants people to learn to be friends.
