

## Eastside Literacy Talk Time Summer 2006

### Topic: Stores & Shopping

#### Let's get started...

If you had a million dollars, what is the first thing that you would buy? Why?

#### Background:

Whether you do your shopping mostly in retail stores, thrift stores, or at garage and yard sales, there are some strategies that will work for you and help you to find a good bargain every time! Certain items go on sale at different times of the year. Here is a list of items that regularly go on sale. Most items go on sale at the beginning of the season they are used due to competition for sales. They also go on sale at the end of the season during clearance sales.

**January:** winter clothes, holiday clearance, white sale (towels, bedding, etc.)

**February:** household items, furniture, dinnerware, electronics

**March:** garden supplies, spring clothes, winter outdoor recreation equipment

**April:** seasonal clothes, clearance on Easter dresses, men's suits and ties

**May:** white sales, tires, home maintenance items, handbags, lingerie

**June:** summer clothing, television sets, refrigerators, home improvement products

**July:** clearance on summer clothes & bathing suits, clearance on air conditioners, home appliances, rugs and carpets, radios and stereo equipment, summer sports equipment, used cars

**August:** furniture; white sales, clearance on outdoor sports equipment, clearance on barbecues, air conditioners, fans, lawn mowers, school supplies, new car clearance

**September:** back to school clothes & supplies, gardening supplies, rugs, lamps & dishes, bicycles

**October:** fishing supplies, school clothes & supplies clearance, cars, crystal & silver

**November:** coats, boots, gloves, quilts and blankets, heating appliances

**December:** toys, holiday items (tablecloths, gift items, party ware), day after Christmas clearance sales
